You will also see lots of useful handouts, grids and planners at the bottom of the THINGS TO PRINT page.



Semester 2 Prize Giving


This will have to be a single cohort activity as we still have COVID restrictions that need to be adhered to. There will be more information forthcoming next week, as we collect the data from the student reports.

Many teachers from the College are HSC marking a variety of subjects and from this activity our school obtains invaluable information about the marking process and what makes a successful, competitive HSC student.

HSC 2022

Year 11 students have already commenced the HSC component of their work towards this qualification. The first round of assessment tasks are about to start. A reminder that tasks need to be submitted on time. If illness occurs, the student needs to ask for an illness/misadventure form, and a student must not be absent the day before a task is due, as that can be considered malpractice in having extra time to complete a task. The Calendar of assessment tasks for Year 11/12 is live and easily accessible to parents and students. Make sure that the diary is used to record the dates of all tasks due. Organisation is often the key to success.

Career Pathways



For many of our students, an apprenticeship or traineeship is their post school destination pathway.

In times gone by, if you wanted to enter an apprenticeship, you commonly left in Year 10. However, with many changes in both the educational and construction sectors, it is more common for students to complete their HSC before entering into an apprenticeship or traineeship. In fact, some companies are specifically looking for students who are Year 12 school leavers.

This does not mean that students cannot begin to prepare for their entry into an apprenticeship whilst still at school. There are many skills and requirements that companies are looking for when hiring apprentices.

The College receives regular emails from Group Training Organisations with apprenticeship and traineeship vacancies, which are regularly posted on Compass for Years 10, 11 and 12 students. Here are some insights into what these Group Training Organisations are looking for in an apprenticeship/traineeship applicant.

- The Construction industry mostly wants applicants to have a Driver's Licence (not L's) and possibly their own car.
- If students are interested in entering the Construction industry, they should aim to have their L's at 16.
- Employment whilst at school is favourable students are encouraged to have a part time job.
- Excellent attendance and punctuality at school is something employers are looking for.
- Make sure you have a suitable and appropriate email address and voicemail.
- Experience is not required, but related subjects are highly regarded e.g. Studying Construction in Years 11 and 12 means you obtain a White Card plus complete Work Placement, making you very employable.
- A sound work ethic, time management and showing initiative are all strong qualities employers are looking for.
