The 2022 school year has all but drawn to a close and staff and students are looking forward to a well-earned break after a busy but successful year.

The last two weeks have included the Step Up Into Senior School (SUISS) program for Year 10 continuers, Lifesaving Week for Year 9 at Riverstone Pool, and our Annual Prize-Giving Ceremony. The SUISS Program included a series of workshops covering study skills and self-management, wellbeing, careers, respectful relationships and mental health, supplemented by two outstanding guest speakers - acclaimed motivational speaker, Daniel Merza, and Matt Cameron, who is very well known in Western Sydney, as a former staff member at our College, and in his current role as the Head of Football at the Penrith Panthers. Lifesaving Week was an outstanding success again this year. Reports from staff indicated that the students were outstanding, whether it be the struggling swimmers looking to improve their stroke and survival skills, or the advanced swimmers working on the rescue and resuscitation skills. Interestingly, students invariably rate this event as one of their best experiences they have during their time at the College.

We also received the HSC results for our class of 2022 and once again our students have done extremely well, with several students scored very high ATARs and a significant number achieving strong HSC packages of results, in many cases exceeding their own expectations. We wish all our Year 12 students every success as they move into university, apprenticeships or other career pathways in 2023 and beyond.

In terms of thanks for this year – on behalf of the Student Formation Leaders – I would like to express our genuine thanks to all the parents who have been so supportive of our efforts to guide and encourage their sons this year, especially on those occasions when students have been struggling with or avoiding school. In many ways, this work lies at the heart of our mission as a Catholic school, however, we are fully aware that without your support, we are far less likely to have success in turning around the prospects of these students.

Once again, we remind parents to start planning for 2023 in terms of organising uniform and laptops for their sons. In the last 2 years, supply issues caused by the lockdowns in Australia and overseas had a serious impact on delivery times for these items, so we recommend that parents place orders as early as possible. Laptops are a crucial learning tool, for staff and students at Patrician Brothers' Blacktown, and we ask all parents and students to make sure that device purchases are prioritised in coming weeks. We understand that these purchases have a significant impact on family budgets, but we also know that Christmas and Boxing Day sales offer some of the best deals all year.

As 2022 draws to a close, we have had many opportunities for celebrating the achievements of our students and their learning this year. Many students receiving awards and recognition for their hard work, effort and aptitude in a range of academic, sporting, service and cultural aspects of school life.

Yesterday, the 15th December, was the scheduled date for HSC results to be released and thus an important time for our Year 12 students and their families. The hard work and commitment of students over many years pays the greatest rewards in receipt of the Higher School Certificate (HSC). The HSC is a solid credential in its own right. The completion of this milestone is one to be celebrated.

We are very proud of all of our students who approached their HSC studies with clear focus. Many students who undertook a HSC+ pathway were able to attain a HSC and also gain dual credentials in one or more VET courses. To gain the credential students are required to complete all course competencies over a two year period. Many students who undertook these courses gained full completion in the Certificate II and Certificate III VET courses, which are the same nationally accredited courses that can be undertaken at TAFE and private providers. We congratulate all of these students.

Many students who undertake their HSC and seek to attain an ATAR also engage with one VET course as a part of their studies. To be eligible for an ATAR the students must also complete an optional HSC exam in their course. This year, we are thrilled to share that our student, Adalrico Liu, who completed the Certificate II in Construction Pathways course and undertook the HSC exam was placed 5th in the State of NSW. This is a most wonderful achievement.

Our HSC class of 2022 have attained most impressive results, which we believe may be the best results achieved by any previous year at the College. The College Dux for 2022 is Pavithran Visakesvaran. Pavi has been noted on the NESA HSC All Rounders List and received an ATAR of 99.60. As a community, we congratulate and celebrate with Pavi this amazing achievement. The College also has 35 mentions on the NESA Distinguished Achievers List. We are delighted that these Band 6 results are from across most courses and from a broad representation of the Year 12 group as well.

We will be spending some time over the coming break and early next term to delve into the results analysis as a staff, in KLA faculty groups and as teachers. We will provide more details in The Focus in 2023. I wish to thank and congratulate all of the HSC teachers in 2022 who have taught, cared for and supported the students so well and for their part in these exceptional results.

Career Pathways Update

Step Up Into Senior School (SUISS) - Careers Session

As part of the recent SUISS program, Year 10 students attended a careers session called *Preparing for your future*. The aim of the session was for students to see the next two years as an opportunity to get ready for the world of work. In order to do this, students learnt the importance of having a sound knowledge of the labour market, understanding trends in industries, occupations and skills, so as to help them make informed decisions about their post school destination pathway.



After brainstorming what job they expected to do when they were 30, students realised that the range of jobs listed was very limited. We then reflected on a quote - *You cannot be, what you cannot see*. The students realised that if they do not know a job exists, then they won't aspire to take on that occupation. This reinforced the need to understand the world of work.

Another area explored were the skills needed in every profession known as enterprise or employability skills. Students were encouraged to take every opportunity throughout their senior schooling to build upon these skills. Working a part-time job is another important way to build upon these skills.



The boys were enthusiastic and actively participated in the session. They are to be congratulated for their mature approach to discussing their future and for their insightful input. I look forward to working with this cohort throughout 2023/4 as they continue to prepare for their future.

Step Up Into Teaching (SUIT) - Australian Catholic University (ACU)

As you may be aware, two of our Year 11 students **Samuel Milonakis** and **Joachim Tabone** were successful in gaining a place in the early entry scheme - Step Up Into Teaching (SUIT) with the Australian Catholic University (ACU). Getting to school by bus in 2023

Will your child be catching the bus to school in 2023? Applications are now open for a School Opal cards. As it's a busy time of year, we highly recommend you make this application before the end of Term 4. It's also good to check the bus timetable to make your child's journey to school as easy as possible.

Here is how it works:

School Opal cards

All students catching the bus in 2023 will need a School Opal card.

Under the School Student Transport Scheme, eligible students can apply for free or subsided travel between home and school.

For more information about the School Student Transport Scheme and how to apply for a School Opal Card, visit https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/#/ from a desktop computer, and click 'apply for a school travel pass'. Applications for 2023 opened at the start of Term 4.

Bus timetables

Busways is the school bus operator that runs your schools' bus services. To find your child's school bus timetable visit the Busways website by using the following steps:

- 1. Go to busways.com.au/nsw
- 2. Click on 'school services' in the navigation bar and then proceed to 'school timetables'
- 3. Enter the school's name in the field that says 'enter a school name'
- 4. Select the school's name and the timetable should open on your device.

If you are unable to find or search for the school's name, use the drop-down menus on the same web page to find the school.

5. Once the timetable is opened, you will be able to identify which school bus services are available in your area for your child to use.




